

**CITY OF LITCHFIELD  
CITY WIDE BRUSH AND LEAF PICK UP  
SEASONAL SCHEDULE**

The City of Litchfield will begin its seasonal brush and leaf pick up beginning April 1<sup>st</sup> and will continue through June 5<sup>th</sup>.

The seasonal brush and leaf pick up will resume on October 15<sup>th</sup> and will continue through November 15<sup>th</sup>.

In the event of a storm, brush and leaves from the storm will be picked up within a two-week period.

Residents are reminded that brush must be stacked in four (4) foot bundles. Grass clipping will not be picked up.

Brush must be separated from leaf piles.

Brush and leaves must be place near the curb or just off the roadway. No debris can be placed in the road.

Brush and leaf pick up is weather dependent. The department of Public Works will adjust pick up schedules without notice.

Residents are encouraged to take brush, leaves and/or grass clippings to the City of Litchfield Compost area located on Hawkes Drive in Litchfield Industrial Park. No building materials are allowed.

There are two gates for the City of Litchfield Compost. The Leaf Dump is the Red Gate (1<sup>st</sup> Gate). Only the following items are permitted in the Leaf Dump: leaves, grass clippings, wood chips and sawdust.

The Brush Dump is the Old Lagoon (2<sup>nd</sup> Gate). Only the following items are permitted in the Brush Dump: brush, logs, stumps, lawn waste (other than grass clippings), garden waste, dirt, and sod.

Keys for both gates are available to be checked out from the City Office.

**OPEN BURNING.**

No person shall kindle a fire in or upon any street or alley, nor within twenty-five of any building, unless such fire is confined in a safe container, and in no case within fifteen feet of any building or adjacent property. Every person who shall kindle any fire shall have some competent person constantly in charge of said fire until it is completely extinguished. In the event of hazardous or unsafe conditions, the burning can be discontinued by a qualified professional, such as Police, Fire, Superintendent of Public Works, or the City Manager.
